Schedule of Events

Wednesday July 24, Arrival - 5:00pm. All artists are cordially invited to a welcome cocktail social gathering at The Castine Inn on Main St. Artists receive a complimentary beverage courtesy of CAA. It's a great opportunity to meet other participating artists, as well as connect with the Plein Air committee and our local sponsors.

Thursday July 25th - 6:00 - 9:00am. Artist Registration at the Town Common, Court St. At this time artists are required to have all canvases/panels/paper stamped and you will also be given a Festival Bag with your all-important name tag, your artwork labels and inventory form, and many other items. All artists must register before beginning painting.

Saturday 27th, 4 to 6pm- Reception, Award Ceremony, and Sale.

- **IMPORTANT:** Between 12pm and 2pm. **Deliver your art to your assigned table** at the Alford Student Center, Maine Maritime Academy, Pleasant St. All artists will have a pre-assigned table, so there is no need to rush to be in line to claim a table. A chart showing the location of your table will be on display. Tables will be set up in the dining commons and in the adjacent Harborview Room.
- Art Judging: 2pm to 3:30pm. Artists must vacate the premises during judging.
- Award Ceremony: 3:30pm, Alford student Center dining commons. Please return for the awards ceremony!
- Public Reception and Art Sale: 4:00pm to 6:00pm.

Housing

For those who have requested host housing in Castine, you will be hearing from our housing committee as soon as they find a host for you. Please contact your host to let them know when you will be arriving, and for directions to their home. Since our hosts are committing to house a festival artist for several nights, please

use discretion when considering bringing a spouse or partner. Host responsibilities are limited to bed & bath, and a light breakfast (optional by host).

Orientation - in your Artist's Packet

- Artwork Inventory Form. **Each artist must complete this form** by listing each piece of art to be displayed at the Reception and Sale. **Please note:** There is a limit of six (6) paintings per artist for display and judging at the reception.
- Individual Artwork Labels: Artists must complete a label for each piece of art they display for sale. **Information on the label should match information on the Artwork Inventory Form.** Labels may be attached to the frame or on your display table using clear round stickers, provided.
- Map of Castine with key locations for artists. These will also be provided at host houses.
- Collection of brochures and promotions from local businesses.
- Maine Home and Design Publications
- Plein Air Magazine, June-July issue.

Rules and Guidelines for the Festival!

For all participating artists, in order to have a smooth running festival, we would like you to observe the following rules and guidelines.

- Artists are required to have all canvases/panels/paper stamped before beginning work. So please register at the Town Common on Thursday morning before beginning to paint. There is no limit to the number of canvases that may be stamped, but you are limited to six (6) paintings for sale at Saturday's reception.
- Previously toned canvases are permitted.
- Maximum canvas size is 18 x 24 or the equivalent in square inches.
- Media permitted: Oil, acrylic, watercolor and pastel.
- Each piece of art must be started and completed en plein air during the festival.
- The event will be held rain or shine, so please come prepared.
- An artist may paint any subject of their choice anywhere within the limits of the Town of Castine (map is included in your Artists Festival Bag or at your host home).
- No "street" sales are allowed. Private commissions are not permitted during the festival. The public is encouraged to watch artists at work but may NOT conduct business with you. Please advise anyone who approaches you for any such transaction about this rule.
- Artists must **frame all paintings** they wish to display and sell (up to six), and bring them to the Alford Center, Pleasant St. at the Maine Maritime Academy on Saturday between 12:00 and 2:00PM. Your assigned table will be waiting.
- Gallery wrap is not an acceptable form of framing.
- Each artist will be responsible for transporting their artwork to and from the exhibition venue. There is limited access by automobile to the center. There is a large parking lot on Stevens St, diagonally across the street from Alford.
- Each artist will be assigned an eight foot long table to display their artwork. The tables will be labeled with your name. A diagram locating your table will be available at the Alford Center.
- Three (3) small table easels will be available for each artist. You are encouraged to bring additional easels of your own. Should you wish to have a table cloth, please supply your own. The tables are eight foot long utility tables.
- All displayed paintings must have a visible CAA Plein Air Festival stamp. For those displaying watercolors with a backing, we would like to add an additional stamp to the backing. Call Don Tenney (207-322-6862).
- Each artist is limited to six (6) paintings which you may display at the reception.
- Each painting must be accompanied by an **artwork label** (find these in your Artists Festival Bag) which the artist fills out: Artist, Title, Dimensions, Medium and selling Price, plus a space to add the buyer's name. There will be a pack of clear round adhesive stickers for you to attach each label to the frame or table next to each painting. Additional labels and adhesive stickers will be available at the cashier's desk.

- In addition, the artist will fill out an **Artwork Inventory Form** with the same information as on the artwork label. The form must be **submitted to the cashier** desk prior to the reception.
- There will be an **Awards Ceremony** for artists at 3:30pm in the dining commons of the Alford Center. Prizes will be awarded for first, second, and third place, plus five honorable mention awards. In addition the CAA will award a “Castine Captured” award to the painting that best evokes a strong sense of Castine.
- Each artist will set the selling price of their paintings and agree to price their work commensurate with their normal retail pricing structure.
- Sold Artwork: When you have a buyer, tell them to stay with you and the painting until you summon a ‘floater’ cashier (wearing a red apron) to have a sales slip filled out for the buyer. The floater will place a red dot on the artwork label. The buyer will take the sales slip to the cashier. The label will remain with the painting on your table until it can be removed by the buyer.
- We request that award winning artwork remain on display at the artists table until 5:30 PM.
- We request that all artwork remain on display, to the extent possible, at your artists table until at least 5:00 PM.
- CAA will take every precaution to ensure the safety of your work. However, CAA cannot be held liable for any damage or loss to artwork or frames.
- CAA will receive 40% of the sale price of each painting that is sold and the artist will receive 60% of the sales price. You will receive a check for your sales within 30 days of the end of the festival, mailed to the address you provided in your enrollment form. We will be charging state sales tax for each transaction. Your fee will be based on the pre-tax amount of the sale. A copy of your Artwork Inventory Form will be included.
- Unsold artwork must be removed from the exhibition venue at the close of the public sale and not before.

Summary Procedure for Selling (Purchasing) Your Art!

1. Buyer expresses interest in purchasing a piece of artwork.
2. **IMPORTANT:** Stay at your table with the buyer.
3. Raise your hand high and summon a ‘floater’ cashier assigned to your area.
4. Floater will fill out a sales slip with the information from the Artwork Label, and add the buyer’s name to the label.
5. Floater adds a red dot to the artwork label indicating it has been sold.
6. Buyer proceeds to the cashier to complete the sale by check, cash or credit card.
7. The buyer’s sales slip will be stamped with the CAA stamp indicating payment was received.
8. Buyer may remove the painting per the instructions above (after 5:30 if an award winner; after 5:00 otherwise).
